

Competition Law in ASEAN: Is Harmonisation Achievable?

The Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) has established the ASEAN Economic Community as a regional common market to more closely integrate its 10 member states' economies, but without supranational laws or legal institutions. Competition law and policy has been identified as an important component of ASEAN's single market strategy, though a lot more needs to be done to achieve the goals set out in the ASEAN Competition Action Plan. This presentation will share the results of a recently conducted empirical survey-study gathering inputs from stakeholders about the challenges and prospects for convergence between the national competition law frameworks of the ASEAN Member States.
